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I. CONSISTENCY OF BUSINESS PLAN WITH COUNTRY PARTNERSHIP STRATEGY

1. The country operations business plan (COBP), 2019–2021, for Turkmenistan is, by and large, aligned with the country partnership strategy, 2017–2021, of the Asian Development Bank (ADB), ¹ which provides for the three major avenues of support: (i) hydrocarbon market diversification and energy trade promotion, (ii) diversification of the non-hydrocarbon sectors through transport infrastructure investment to improve market connectivity and private sector development, and (iii) knowledge work on economic diversification and reforms, as derived from the government development objectives. This COBP embraces key priorities and outcomes stemming from ADB's Strategy 2030.²

II. INDICATIVE RESOURCE PARAMETERS

2. Turkmenistan, a group C developing member country, is eligible for regular ordinary capital resources (OCR) lending. The indicative resources available during 2019–2021 for sovereign operations amount to \$150 million (\$50 million per year). ADB, jointly with the country, will explore cofinancing and funding from other sources to cover OCR cumulative volumes envisaged under this COBP. Turkmenistan may also tap resources available from ADB's nonsovereign window to encourage private sector financing in areas ranging from infrastructure to manufacturing exhibiting strong economies of scale.

3. For 2019–2021, the firm lending program amounts to \$150 million plus another \$690 million for standby projects.³ The final amount of lending is subject to resource availability and project readiness. The big-ticket projects need to undergo a comprehensive pre-investment due diligence so as to ascertain that they will (i) improve the welfare of beneficiaries and the country as a whole, and (ii) pose no risk to the country's fiscal and debt position. Transaction technical assistance included in the nonlending program will underpin government efforts towards carrying out such pre-investment evaluations. Only with favorable outcomes of the due diligence stocktaking, can the projects be recommended to proceed to the investment phase. All this would, in turn, represent an effective response to the existing environment considered deficient in strong enough national frameworks for the appraisal and selection of investment projects. The nonlending program amounts to \$1.375 million.

4. For 2018, a firm \$500 million electricity transmission project would address the ageing transmission infrastructure, poor reliability and lack of interconnection with the other regions in the country.⁴ With only \$50 million allocated for 2018, additional resources will come from the departmental OCR headroom.

5. The country assistance results areas by sector of interventions are in Appendix 1, while the projects in the pipeline are detailed in Appendix 2, where cost figures are to be deemed provisional, project-wise. Appendix 3 presents the assistance program for 2018 and Appendix 4 shows the indicative knowledge publications and events for 2018–2019.

III. SUMMARY OF CHANGES TO LENDING AND NONLENDING PROGRAMS

6. Although weaknesses in the country's public investment and debt management institutions remain, this COBP, unlike the previous ones, takes a regular 3-year cycle to better reflect an additional financing modality, which is now envisaged for some of the planned projects.

7. Estimated at \$300 million in OCR, a regional gas transmission project—Turkmenistan— Afghanistan—Pakistan—India Natural Gas Pipeline—is the only addition to this COBP, albeit in a strictly standby mode. With this project, ADB broadens targets in the energy sector where previous plans were solely focused on electricity generation and/or transmission, and a sector share of the COBP envelope (inclusive of firm and standby endeavors) rises notably.

8. ADB has refined the only transport sector project—while keeping it in the rail transport subsector—in terms of the regional transport corridors to be modernized but with no change in development outcomes to be contributed to and assistance areas to be involved in. The project's refined title is "Central Asia Regional Economic Cooperation Corridors 2, 3 and 6 Railway Modernization Project", which is expected to be a multiphase program provisionally scheduled for 2019–2021.⁵

9. Aiming for the same outcome and areas as before, ADB has re-planned the Small and Medium-Sized Enterprise Finance Project to be implemented in four phases (with each phase up to \$50 million). In the previous pipeline, ADB pursued an unphased \$200-million intervention related to small and medium-sized enterprises.

⁵ In the transport sector, ADB will focus its support to the rail transport subsector, with the continued intention to support the improvement of Central Asia Regional Economic Cooperation Corridors 2, 3 and 6 linking Turkmenabat to Turkmenbashi. ADB currently envisages a three-phase program, with the first phase being supported by a standalone project for processing on a standby basis in 2019, and subsequent phases being supported by additional financing thereto, in 2020 and 2021, subject to project readiness. A transaction technical assistance facility approved in May 2018 (TA 9524-TKM) will support project preparation.
