# Introduction

stablished on 29 November 2006, the Water Financing Partnership Facility (WFPF) aims to provide additional financial and knowledge resources from development partners to support the implementation of the Asian Development Bank's (ADB) Water Financing Program and help achieve the following targeted outcomes by 2020: (i) 500 million people with sustainable access to safe drinking water and improved sanitation; (ii) 170 million people with reduced risks to floods; and (iii) 95 million people with more productive and efficient irrigation and drainage services. The Facility comprises three trust funds: (i) the Multidonor Trust Fund with contributions from Australia, Austria, Norway¹, Spain, and Switzerland, (ii) the Netherlands Trust Fund, and (iii) the Sanitation Financing Partnership Trust Fund with contribution from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

This Semiannual Progress Report covers the period January to June 2019 and presents the overall implementation progress against the 2019 Annual Work Program and the Facility's revised Design and Monitoring Framework (DMF).

The WFPF supports ADB's Water Financing Program, which aims to deliver by 2020 more and better water and sanitation investments in the region that will help:

# Highlights and Key Achievements

This section of the report highlights how WFPF has supported realizing impact and results on the ground, delivering investments, and increasing knowledge base.

# Impact: Voices from Project Beneficiaries

The Semiannual Progress Report continues to share stories and feedback from local communities and people who have experienced concrete benefits from WFPF-supported projects.

Lake-based boat communities in Cambodia benefit from innovative on-site sanitation system. Communities on the Tonle Sap are now reaping the rewards of the recently completed solar septic tank (SST) pilot testing under the WFPF-supported Second Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Sector Project.

Inundated for a bigger part of the year, the area's households, schools, and health centers used to suffer from poorly maintained toilets and overflowing untreated waste from ill-maintained septic tanks. SST is an on-site sanitation system for off-grid locations that uses a modified conventional septic tank equipped with a solar water heating device that increases the temperature inside the septic tank, thus inactivating pathogens and converts organic wastes into methane (biogas) and alleviates the environmental problems associated with fecal sludge handling of a typical septic tank system.

Results indicate that SSTs are a viable option for on-site treatment that prevents untreated wastewater spillage and provides effluent quality that is acceptable to river discharge, thereby lessening pollution to the lake. Most importantly, the SSTs encourage the community's active participation in maintaining the facilities and effectively raises awareness on the importance of proper sanitation.

The same pilot application is about to commence in peri-urban settlements in Papua New Guinea to support the preparation of the Urban Water Supply and Sanitation Project planned for 2019 approval.

Provincial nam papas (PNPs) in Lao People's Democratic Republic (Lao PDR) gain more knowledge on better asset management. Nam papas or water utilities in Lao PDR strive to raise their capacity and improve operations for the communities they serve. Amsterdam's World WaterNet, an organization that is committed to share knowledge on water resources management, mentored PNP Luang Namtha through ADB's Water Operators Partnerships (WOPs) Program. Established since 2007, WOPs is ADB's peer-to-peer learning initiative that capitalizes on established water utilities' operational experience, positioning them as mentors to water operators in need of guidance.

For this WOP, the focus was on improving Luang Namtha's asset and financial management practices in order for staff to make better informed decisions on investment prioritization and future business expansion. With the guidance of their mentor, the Luang Namtha water utility developed a GIS-based asset database system which allows them to better respond to customers' needs, be more proactive in network maintenance, and better capture asset information, all of which led to improved bottom line.

Fueled by their success and desire to help out fellow Laotian operators, Luang Namtha included Bokeo and Luang Prabang nam papas toward the latter part of their WOP program so they can, in turn, improve their operations. At a national conference for water operators, Luang Namtha shared their WOP experience and best practices to encourage others to strive for better services even with limited resources. As a direct result of this partnership, Luang Namtha is now a recipient of the Netherlands WaterWorX program which aims to help provide access to safe drinking water to 10 million people worldwide by 2030.<sup>2</sup>

WaterWorX is the joint program of ten Dutch water companies set up to ensure a substantial contribution to the Directorate General for International Cooperation WASH Policy 2016–2030.

# Investments: Staying On-track Toward the Annual Target

Helping meet the annual investment target. During the first half of 2019, ADB committed a total of \$0.507 billion for 13 projects, of which an equivalent of \$0.14 billion (28%) consisting of two projects benefitted from WFPF resources through project preparation support.<sup>3</sup> Tables 1 and 2 summarize the subsector and regional distribution of committed investments, respectively.

While the January to June 2019 committed investment is only 25% of the annual minimum target of \$2.0 billion, it is expected that the total commitment by the end of the year will reach the target, noting that the total programmed commitment for 2019 is at \$3.85 billion for a total of 46 projects.

Sustaining WFPF direct project support. A total of \$1.825 million was allocated during the reporting period for seven projects to support preparation of more investment projects covering urban water supply, urban and rural sanitation, irrigation and drainage, flood management, and water resources management.

To further boost WFPF support for investment projects that promote the water-food security nexus, approved allocations during the period included three projects in Cambodia, Philippines, and Viet Nam by topping up the funds for a transaction technical assistance facility (F-TRTA), the Southeast Asia Agriculture, Natural Resources and Rural Development Facility. This aims to provide project preparation and implementation support, capacity building, and policy advice to a series of ongoing and ensuing projects for the said sectors in Southeast Asia in line with Strategy 2030 during 2018 to 2023. The F-TRTA approach enhances efficiency in project preparation and administration through (i) reduced time for TA processing, approval, and administration; and (ii) accelerated recruitment process by prequalifying consultants for all the project preparation and implementation support under the facility.

In Cambodia, support will be provided in preparing the multitranche financing facility (MFF) for the Integrated Water Resources Management Investment Program (Box 1), which aims to improve reliability of year-round water supply to all types of water users, enhance resilience to climate change impacts, and ensure fully functioning, productive, and profitable irrigation schemes. The first tranche is estimated at \$80.0 million.

# Box 1: Integrated Water Resources Management Investment Program in Cambodia

The program's expected outputs are: (i) nationwide climate and water resources monitored and assessed; (ii) water resources efficiently and effectively managed and allocated at priority river basins; (iii) additional water resources for multipurpose uses and water accessibility at the tail-end users improved at selected irrigation schemes; and (iv) capacity for monitoring and evaluating irrigation schemes performance improved.

In the Philippines, WFPF will also support preparation of the proposed Mindanao Irrigation Development Project Phase 1 which seeks to enhance reliability and efficiency of agricultural water supplies and sustainability of irrigation infrastructure.

In Viet Nam, the preparation of the proposed Climate Adaptation through Irrigation Modernization Sector Project (Box 2) will also benefit from WFPF's support. The proposed project will finance modernized climate resilient irrigation and drainage systems in selected provinces. WFPF will support integrated solutions through structural design with climate resilience, operations and maintenance, water management system, and water allocation plan to maximize irrigation and drainage capacity.

#### Box 2: Climate Adaptation through Irrigation Modernization Sector Project in Viet Nam

The project will: (i) support policy and institutional development measures to ensure competitiveness of agricultural products and sustainable water resources from modernized irrigation and drainage systems, (ii) standardize a guideline on infrastructural design, operation and maintenance (O&M) for advanced technologies, and a program for asset management, (iii) modernize irrigation and drainage systems covering 65,900 hectares (ha), and (iv) improve on-farm productivity of agriculture and water in subproject command areas with participation by water users.

# Knowledge and Information: Increasing the Knowledge Base

Sustaining WFPF program quality support. During the reporting period, allocations were approved for two projects amounting to \$0.575 million to support the development of a water resources strategy in Uzbekistan and to accelerate action on rural sanitation in the People's Republic of China (PRC) in light of the government's rural vitalization strategy. The support to Uzbekistan will facilitate preparation of a strategic vision and action plan for the country's water sector development (Box 3).

#### Box 3: Development of Water Resources Strategy in Uzbekistan

This initiative aims to ensure efficient and rational use of water resources in the mid- and long-term. The strategic vision and concept for improved water resources management will be valid until 2030. The main activities include: (i) review of current status of water resources management and analysis of current constraints; (ii) prioritization of development areas and opportunities for applying international best practices and technologies; and (iii) development of recommendations and implementation mechanism for improved water resources management, including institutional and policy analysis and development of a roadmap for actions.

The support to PRC, on the other hand, will help prepare rural vitalization and rural wastewater and sanitation programs and projects through regulatory, financial, and technical guidelines with online toolkits. These toolkits will provide design parameters, suggested treatment processes, effluent qualities, level of operation skills required, capital costs, operational expenses, sludge generation projection, cost recovery calculation, and

more. The guidelines will enable individual villages to negotiate with the local regulators – for example, the local environmental protection bureaus – to permit sustainable and cost effective designs. It is not possible to develop such powerful and practical guidelines and toolkits without intensive survey of local conditions, comprehensive data analysis, and adoption of international experiences.



In Uzbekistan, WFPF is helping to support the development of a water resources strategy that will review current management and water practices, propose areas for improvement, and ensure people have reliable access to water resources.

Delivering results from a completed TA. During the reporting period, the technical assistance completion report (TCR) for the South Asia Urban Knowledge Hub was completed. Cofinanced by WFPF, this technical assistance (TA) strengthened the capacity of urban research and training institutions in South Asia through collaborations with leading urban research institutions in Bangladesh, India, Nepal, and Sri Lanka on (i) developing and disseminating integrated and evidence-based solutions for improved urban management and innovative urban sanitation; and (ii) leading the debate on critical urban issues across the region. The TA results include the following:

- (i) development of an online tool Environmental Sanitation Management Information System for Sri Lanka to enable local authorities to digitally track basic environmental services delivery,
- (ii) formulation of Bangladesh's first Institutional and Regulatory Framework for FSM, endorsed by the government in 2017,
- (iii) inclusion in the university curriculum of three modules related to environmental sanitation and infrastructure in Sri Lanka's University of Moratuwa,
- (iv) establishment of the Centre for Urban Planning Studies at the Institute of Engineering in Tribhuvan University in Nepal, the first of its kind in the country, and approval in May 2015 of a revised curriculum structure (the first time in its 20-year history) and content to include courses on water and sanitation infrastructure for the new intakes,
- (v) inclusion of FSM in the curriculum of six universities in Bangladesh, and
- (vi) initiation of dialogue in India on the future of planning education and discussion on the recommendations to modernize the planning curriculum of the country's top planning schools.

# Progress for January to June 2019

## **Progress on Detailed Planned Activities**

Allocation of funds. A total of nine projects received WFPF funding allocation during the reporting period totaling \$2.40 million spread across various subsectors and providing both direct project support and program quality support. The list of approved allocations is provided in Appendix 1.

Portfolio management. Disbursement and financial closing of completed projects were closely monitored. During the reporting period, nine projects were financially closed, comprising four TA projects and five direct charges, freeing up a total of \$398,409 in savings. A total of \$85.456 million has been disbursed for the entire Facility against the total committed amount of \$102.822 million or 83% disbursement rate. The status of overall Facility disbursement in the last five years is summarized in Table 3. The detailed disbursement per trust fund is provided in the section on Fund Disbursements (page 20).

Annual consultation meeting. The regular annual donor consultation meeting for all financing partnership facilities (FPFs) did not push through in March. As an alternative for WFPF, a side meeting has been arranged during the Stockholm World Water Week on 26 August 2019 with the Governments of Australia, Netherlands, and Switzerland, and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. To provide an opportunity for a face-to-face meeting for all WFPF and other FPFs, a daylong meeting is scheduled on 4 November 2019 at the ADB headquarters on the sideline of the Asian Development Fund (ADF) negotiations.

Resource mobilization. In March 2019, the Government of Australia contributed an additional AUS\$1.0 million (US\$709,700 equivalent) to the Facility and further indicated intent to contribute an additional AUS\$5.0 million over the period 2020–2022. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation has also approved in principle an additional contribution of \$3.0 million to fund a regional knowledge and support TA to accelerate promotion of citywide/countrywide inclusive sanitation.

Continued strengthening of the Water Sector Group Secretariat. Two more specialists came on board in May 2019: a Water Supply and Sanitation Specialist<sup>6</sup> and a Senior Water Resources Specialist seconded from the Government of Netherlands.

Monitoring sanitation-related commitments. The performance against sanitation-related commitments is summarized in Table 4.

Tracking the progress of the Water Financing Program. The progress towards the achievement of the Water Financing Program targets and WFPF contribution are summarized in the following tables.

Table 5 summarizes the committed investments from 2006 to June 2019, while the breakdown of investments in water supply and sanitation are provided in Tables 6 and 7. As explained in the 2018 Annual Report, the WFPF reporting on water investments for that year was changed from "approved" to "committed" to align with the shift in ADB reporting methodology. Committed means that the ADB management-approved investments have been signed by its government counterpart.

For consistency, this change has been applied retroactively to 2006 to 2017 water investments. This resulted in reduction in amounts reported in 2018: 3% for the overall Water Financing Program and 8% for WFPF-supported projects, because some approved projects remain uncommitted while others were cancelled after approval. The Water Financing Program's overall achievement to date is at 87% which is on track towards achieving the 2020 target of \$30 billion in water investments.

Table 8 summarizes the overall progress toward the target number of beneficiaries with the details on beneficiaries of water supply and sanitation provided in Table 9. Consequent to the change in reporting methodology, the target number of beneficiaries was ralso reduced, due to the uncommitted approved projects and those cancelled after approval: 17% for Water Financing Program and 18% for WFPF-supported projects.

As part of reporting enhancements, beneficiaries from water supply and sanitation projects are segregated to (i) beneficiaries from water supply only, (ii) beneficiaries from sanitation only, and (iii) beneficiaries from both water supply and sanitation to correctly capture the results of investments wherein a fraction of the population may benefit from more than one project component. Whereas in the past, confusion on how to account for multiple benefits have yielded inflated numbers, this new manner of reporting will accurately illustrate how an investment program impacts the public. As in the case of investment target, the current progress is on track to achieving the 2020 target of 115 million people benefiting from investments attributable to WFPF.

#### **Fund Utilization**

The Status of Grant Reports for the Netherlands Trust Fund and Sanitation Trust Fund include the earmarked amount of \$1.0 million each for the funded specialists: Water Resources Specialist (Food Security) and Sanitation Specialist, respectively. For consistency, those amounts have been included in the succeeding presentations. In the case of the contribution from Spain under the Multidonor Trust Fund, the \$0.5 million for water supply specialist is not included in the Status of Grant Report and therefore not included in the succeeding tables. Table 13 summarizes the status of fund utilization based on Secretariat tabulation of all approved allocations at the Facility level, while Table 14 presents the figures based on the Status of Grant reports, thus only includes projects already approved by ADB management. #### Resource Allocation Ratio

WFPF has stayed well within the targeted allocation ratio of about 70%–30% between project support and program quality, at 73%–27% as of 30 June 2019 based on cumulative allocations. The ratio during the reporting period is 76%–24%. Table 16 provides the details.

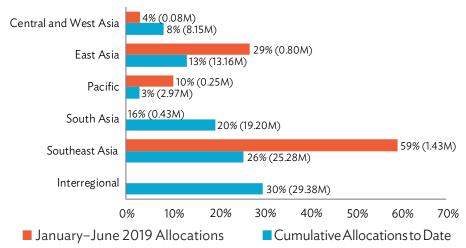


Figure 2: Regional Distribution of Approved Allocations

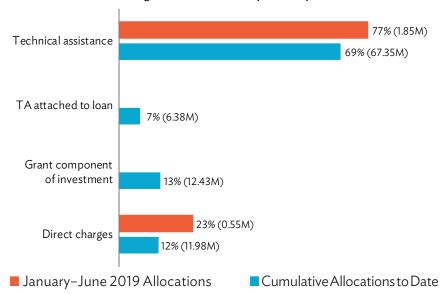


Figure 3: Use of Funds by Modality

Use of funds by modality. Figure 3 presents the distribution by modality with technical assistance still accounting for the highest share.

# Planned Activities for 1 July to 31 December 2019

## Processing of second semester applications

Five applications were lined up for the 31 July 2019 submission deadline which include three TRTAs to support rural sanitation in the PRC and two regional TA projects – one on sanitation and another on the implementation of Strategy 2030 water sector priorities. Based on ongoing discussion with operations departments, additional applications are planned for the remaining submission deadlines during the year (September and November).

# Water Operational Framework 2020-2030

The preparation of the Water Operational Framework will be in full swing during the second half of 2019. Initial internal consultations with ADB operations departments were held in early July 2019. This will was also the main agenda item for the second meeting of the new Water Advisory Group on 24 to 25 July 2019. Consultation with WFPF financing partners and other development partners is planned on 26 August 2019 during the Stockholm World Water Week. A final draft is expected to be completed within the first quarter of 2020.

# Asian Water Development Outlook 2020 Edition

The preparation of the 2020 edition of the Asian Water Development Outlook (AWDO) formally started in February 2019 through an inception workshop between ADB and AWDO partners: International WaterCentre, International Water Management Institute, Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, and the Korea Institute of Civil Engineering and Building Technology. The second workshop is planned for 15–16 August 2019.

# Processing of Major Regional TA Projects

Through WFPF resources, the Water Sector Group Secretariat is preparing the following major TA projects for 30 September 2019 approval:

- (i) Achieving Water Sector Priorities under Strategy 2030 in Asia and the Pacific. The TA will provide operations departments with additional resources to: (a) prepare and implement innovative programs and projects including pilot and demonstration activities, and (b) supporting knowledge managment, strategic collaboration, and capacity development.
- (ii) Accelerating Sanitation for All in Asia and the Pacific. The TA seeks to support: (a) development and implentation of citywide inclusive sanitation (CWIS) projects, (b) development of guidelines for CWIS projects, and (c) improving capacity and awareness on CWIS.
